

Economics Annual Graduate Awards – 2020-2021 Recipients

It is my pleasure to announce that the winner of the 2020-2021 C.A. Curtis Prize is Mr. James McNeil (currently Assistant Professor in the department of Economics at Dalhousie University) for his PhD thesis entitled "An Empirical Analysis of the Conduct and Effects of Monetary Policy," supervised by Professor Gregor Smith.

The Curtis prize: "Established by family, colleagues and former students in memory of Professor C.A. Curtis. Awarded annually for the best doctoral thesis in economics. Applications must be submitted by the thesis supervisor in January. Any Ph.D. thesis in economics completed during the preceding two calendar years is eligible for consideration."

Please join me in congratulating Nam Phan for winning the Mac Urquhart PhD Award for his 2nd Year Research Paper "Evaluating the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy in a DMP Model with Wealth Accumulation." He is supervised by Brant Abbott.


