The Teaching Assistant (TA) positions listed below *may* be available for this upcoming 2019-20 academic year.

Graduate Teaching Assistants and Teaching Fellows at Queen's University are governed by the Collective Agreement between the Public Service Alliance of Canada (PSAC) and the University (<http://www.queensu.ca/facultyrelations/teaching-assistants-and-fellows/collective-agreement>). Remuneration will be in accordance with the Collective Agreement.

Appointments will be allocated, to qualified applicants, based on preference levels as outlined in the collective agreement. For those students who fall into Group A (Qualified Graduate Student for whom a Teaching Assistantship forms part of their funding package), please notify the Graduate Assistant (Danielle Wallace; gradassist@econ.queensu.ca) of your preferences. Student preferences must be received by August 21st, 2019.

For those students who fall into Group B, C & D, please submit a CV and transcript to the Department of Economics for any possible TA positions available after Group A.

The Department will attempt to allocate Teaching Assistantships according to the Preferences of Group A students wherever possible. It should be noted that we cannot always satisfy students' requests in the allocation of TA positions.
