ASO will also organize training sessions for TAs and the instructors supporting students in the online environment.

Job Requirements

The teaching assistants that we are seeking are for the support of online courses. Some training and preparation are needed before the start of the course. Candidates must be prepared to work outside the regular 9-5 workweek and have access to the internet and a computer that meets minimum requirements. Experience with learning management systems (e.g. onQ) and videoconferencing software (e.g. Zoom or Adobe Connect) would be an asset.

Contract Hours and Hiring

ASO will contact and offer employment to the available TAs in the order they were submitted as the enrolment increases. The hours in the TA contract will be determined based on actual course enrolment.

Graduate Teaching Assistants and Teaching Fellows at Queen's University are governed by the *Collective Agreement* between the Public Service Alliance of Canada (PSAC) and the University. Remuneration will be in accordance with the *Collective Agreement*, and appointments are subject to funding or enrollment criteria.
