

New Queen's ESL Student Support Services Available

The Queen's School of English is excited to offer two new English language services, <u>Online Language support tutorials</u> and <u>Customized one-on-one virtual tutoring sessions</u>.

Our customized one-on-one virtual tutoring service is ideal for English language learners who want targeted practice in specific language skill areas outside the classroom setting. Students are matched with instructors based on their individual learning needs.

Fee: \$750 (five one-hour virtual tutoring sessions)

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Online Language Support provides weekly 1.5-hour online tutorials for university students currently enrolled in an English-language degree or diploma program. Students meet weekly with qualified and experienced instructors to work on the following:

- ask English language-related questions
- enhance understanding of the course and assignment expectations
- review feedback received from courserelated assignments
- polish academic writing skills
- learn about resources to support academic success
- ask English language-related grammar or vocabulary questions
